Also, be sure to include your name and the number of hours you spent cutting and sorting with your coupon submission.

#### Home Safety Tips

To keep your house warm and cozy this season without jeopardizing your well-being, remember the following tips:

- Hire a trained professional to inspect and clean your home's central heating system once a year
- Fireplaces and wood-burning stoves should be inspected each year and cleaned or repaired as needed

- Space heaters should be placed at least three feet from furniture, people, pets, curtains, or any other object
- Guard against carbon monoxide (CO) by installing at least one CO alarm near sleeping areas and in the basement.

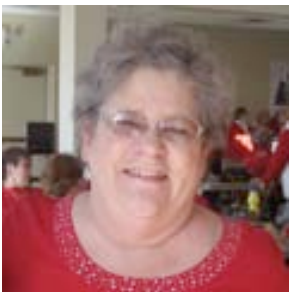


## Domestic Violence

## Hostess Committee Duties

(Volunteers are enlisted for each meeting.

### Social Chair

- If a regular meeting, provide necessary items for refreshment table: tablecloths, plastic silverware, cups, napkins, coffee and tea, creamer, sugar, towels (paper and cloth), and serving pieces. You can use the church's coffee pot.
- If short on supplies, you will find a stash of extra items marked Antioch Woman's Club in the kitchen area of the church. Do not use items not marked AWC.
- Keep receipts for items purchased so cost can be divided among committee members.
- Plan to arrive early at meeting and stay late in order to set up and clean up tables. Enlist help from committee members.
- If a lunch meeting, request committee members to provide a gift (value about \$10) to be used as a door prize instead of a dish for the table
- If a lunch meeting, select someone to present the "prayer before the meal."
- At a lunch meeting, be prepared to hold the drawing for the door prizes after the meal.
- No matter what kind of meeting, secure someone from the committee to give a "thought of the day."

### Hostesses

- Bring assigned items: dessert or appetizers for regular meetings; door prize for lunch meetings.
- Arrive early at the meeting in order to help Head Hostesses set up.
- Plan to stay late to help with cleanup.
- Be prepared to share in the cost of coffee, tea, paper products, etc.
- If you find you cannot attend your assigned meeting, **FIND A REPLACEMENT AND INFORM THE HEAD HOSTESS WHO THAT WILL BE.** Be sure to let your replacement know what you have been assigned to bring and do.
