Focus on Community Safety

This newsletter's safety topic is "Preparing for Tornado Season." Remember the following:

- ✓ --At home, have a family tornado plan in place and practice a family tornado drill at least once a year.
- ✓ --Store protective coverings (e.g .mattress, sleeping bags, thick blankets, etc) in or next to your shelter space.
- ✓ --Avoid windows.
- ✓ --Get in the basement and under some kind of sturdy protection (heavy table or work bench), or cover yourself with a mattress or sleeping bag.
- ✓ --If you don't have a basement, go to the lowest floor and into an interior room. A closet or bathroom is recommended.
- ✓ --If you're in a vehicle, remember that they are easily tossed and destroyed by tornadoes. Your best bet is to take shelter in a sturdy building. If that's not possible, lie flat in a low spot or ditch as far from the road as possible to avoid flying vehicles. Do not park under a bridge or underpass.

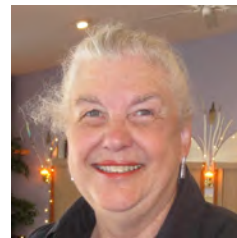

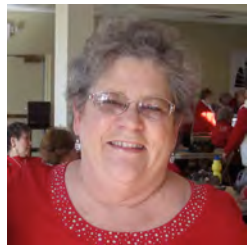
Education Committee

This past January the Health Committee went to Winchester House in Libertyville to celebrate with the residents who had birthdays that month.

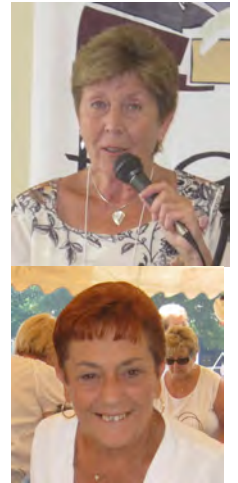

Just as a reminder, Waste Management on Route 173 in Antioch is open for recycling from 7AM to 2:30PM Monday thru Friday. It's real easy. I took an old TV there and all I had to do was unload it in the parking lot. This service is free and a great way to recycle old electronic equipment.

ComEd has a limited-time-only deal going on thru April 30th. They will pick up and dispose of your old freezer or refrigerator and pay you \$50. Contact them at ComEd.com/FridgeRecycling or 888-806-2273.

I receive a "Lake County News" e-mail from Linda Pedersen, our District 1 Representative, which is quite informative. To be put on her mailing list, contact her at lpedersen@lakecountyil.gov or cell#847-445-5504. The latest edition had an interesting article from the Lake County Forest Preserves. During stream monitoring this last summer along the Des Plaines River in southern Lake County, they discovered several dozen Mississippi Grass Shrimp (*Palaimonetes kadikensis*). Due to the fact that you can see right through them, they are commonly called glass shrimp. This is the first documentation of this species that is very rare in northeastern Illinois except in Kane County. This find is very encouraging as it indicates improvement of aquatic habitats and cleaner water in the river area. We like clean water!



Stamps for the Audubon Society

The Franciscan Sisters of the Sacred Heart are no longer collecting stamps, but now we can help the Illinois Audubon Society. The "Stamps for Wildlife Habitat" project has earned over \$35,000 since it began in 1984. So save those stamps, Ladies, and bring them to any meeting.

The usable stamps include the following: canceled commemoratives, airmail stamps, express mail stamps, foreign stamps, duck stamps, state conservation stamps, high denomination definitives, picture postcards (new or used), unused stamps (no matter how old), and stamp collections (complete or incomplete).

FYI: Definitives are the most common stamp. They are usually less than an inch square and are printed in large quantities. These are not worth collecting unless they were issued prior to 1940 or they are of larger denominations (at least \$1.00).

Commemoratives are the backbone of the project. These include special subjects such as people, events, or subjects important to American life and culture.

Picture postcards are highly collectable, especially those from foreign countries. Please save the entire postcard if you are going to donate it.

Save stamps by cutting them from the envelope they came on, leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{8}$ th of an inch of paper around it. Sometimes the top and right margins where the stamp was placed will be smaller. Never try to remove the stamp from the envelope. When in doubt, donate the whole envelope.

Microsoft PowerPoint 2010 Part 1&2

Registering for Part 1 automatically registers participants for Part 2.



PowerPoint is software that is used to create materials that can be presented using a projector. The features of Power

Point 2010 will be introduced. Topics include creating a new presentation, opening and saving an existing presentation, choosing a slide layout, entering information into a slide and running a slide show. **Prerequisite: This class is designed for the student who has basic computer skills and can comfortably navigate a Windows environment.**

Microsoft Word 2010 Part 1&2

Registering for Part 1 automatically registers participants for Part 2.

PART 1: This class is an introduction to the features of Microsoft Word.

Topics include starting Word, creating a new document, opening, saving and navigating a document, moving and copying data, formatting and print previewing documents. **Prerequisite: This class is designed for the student who has basic computer skills and can comfortably navigate a Windows environment.**



PART 2: This class is designed to strengthen the skills learned in Microsoft Word, Part 1. It introduces a number of other techniques that

will enhance the use of the computer to create and edit documents. After completing this class, the student will be able to utilize: Intermediate selection, formatting and editing tools, print preview, and printing as well as other. If there is time basic list creation and basic table creation will be introduced. **Prerequisite:** MS Word—Part 1



Introduction to Email


Learn how email works, navigate to the email provider website, log in to an existing email account, open an existing email and compose a new email. Then, learn about sending, replying to and forwarding messages. Details of working with attachments will also be covered. The class will be taught using Gmail, a free email service provided by Google. **Basic computer skills are required.** If a student does not have an email account an appointment can be made, after class, for a one-on-one session to receive assistance in doing so. A cell phone with text messaging is required to sign-up for an email account.

COMPUTER COACH

One-on-one instruction will help you get started with e-mail, word processing, or other computer skills covered in our current classes. Computer coaching sessions are offered on Thursday evenings. Students can use the library's computer or bring a personal laptop. Please be aware that Computer Coaching sessions are limited to one session per person per month due to the popularity of this program. 

Dolores Abderholden's Daughter Meets with President Obama

Sue Abderholden, Executive Director of the National Alliance of Mental Illness-Minnesota, met with President Obama to participate in a round-table discussion about gun violence on Monday, February 4th.

She stated that she did not want mental illness to become a scapegoat in discussions about gun violence because while some 25 percent of the populations have issues with mental health, only about 5 percent ever commit a crime.

"I told him about discrimination in health care and other disability issues. I've never seen a group discriminated against more," quotes the News Sun of Waukegan on February 8th. Sue also said, "I had a little placard with my name and the White House seal on it, and I asked for his signature and I got it. I'll never forget it."

Abderholden also was interviewed about mental health and violence by Leslie Stahl of CBS' 60 Minutes.
