### Community Service Project

April's community project will be to collect donations

for the food pantry at Open Arms Mission. Please bring one non-perishable food item or an individually wrapped toiletry/paper product to the monthly meeting. Items that are always needed are bar soap, dish soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, baby food and formula, juice boxes or bags, coffee, tea, and adult diapers (especially size small). Thank you in advance for your generosity.

Please note that there will not be food pantry collection in May.

### Safety

This newsletter's safety topic is "Get Ready for Summer." Summer is on its way. You can ensure a season of fun and relaxation by taking some time to establish these outdoor safety measures:

#### **Protect children around the pool**

--secure your pool area by installing a fence—one that closes and latches by itself, and is at least five feet high.

--lock pool chemicals in a secure cabinet out of children's reach.

--assign an adult to watch children carefully at all times when they are in or near the water.

#### **Become a safer griller**

--before using a gas grill, check the connection between the propane tank and the fuel line for leaks by pouring soapy water over it and seeing if bubbles appear. (Never use a match.)

--If you detect a leak, turn off the gas, and do not attempt to relight until the leak is fixed.

--Place the grill at least ten feet away from the house to prevent fires.

#### **Inspect your deck and make it safe**

--Check how your deck is connected to your home. It should be bolted, not nailed.

--Repair any wobbly railings and loose stairs.

--Replace deck boards that have rotted or have large cracks, and any hardware that has red rust.



## International Outreach

International Outreach has several projects that local clubs can choose to participate in.

In October a collection was taken for UNICEF. Operation Smile is an ongoing project that we do monthly, and at our May meeting a collection will be taken for Heifer International.

Heifer International's mission is to work with communities to end world hunger and poverty and to care for the earth. They empower families to turn hunger and poverty into hope and prosperity. The goal of every Heifer project is to help families achieve self-reliance by providing them the tools they need to sustain themselves. It's more than a handout. Monetary donations help to purchase goats, cows, chickens, pigs and sheep, which in turn help the families with food and let them sell the milk, cheese, eggs, etc. to provide income for their family.

Our quilting get-togethers are the 4th Monday of each month from 9 until noon at the Meeting House in Antioch. To date we have completed 50 quilts and collected 55 stuffed animals, 45 toothbrushes, 50 tubes of toothpaste, 42 coloring books, 48 boxes of crayons and 26 bubbles for Operation Smile.



# *Philanthropy and Friendship Antioch Woman's Club*



# **Please read these proposed changes to our Bylaws and be ready to vote on these at the April meeting.**

## **ARTICLE 1 – NAME**

**SECTION 1 – The Association shall be called the Antioch Woman’s Club.**

**TO READ:** The Association shall be called the GFWC Illinois Antioch Women’s Club. (To conform with the Federation)  
Having the name “Woman’s” means the club of one woman; changing it to “Women’s” means the club of many women.

## **ARTICLE V – DUTIES OF CHAIRMEN OF STANDING COMMITTEES**

**SECTION 1 – Delete Ways and Means and insert Fund Raising. (To conform with Federation)**

**SECTION 5 – The Home Life/Health Chairman’s duties are to encourage members to understand and participate in projects related to health and support community health programs, and she shall have charge of the Helping Hands Program, the Dollars and Sense Program, as well as other duties as delineated by the Federation for this committee. Winchester House and Card Ambassador shall become subcommittees of this committee.**

**DELETE - “and she shall have charge of the Helping Hands Program, the Dollars and Sense Program,” (Programs not reported on in Federation).**

**SECTION 6 - The International Outreach Chairman’s duties shall be to increase understanding of international policies, cultural exchange programs, the Reaching Out International Program, the United Nations Program, and any other duties as delineated by the Federation for this committee.**

**DELETE - “the Reaching Out International Program, the United Nations Program” (Programs not reported on in Federation).**

**SECTION 7 - The Membership Chairman’s duties shall be to keep a current up-to-date membership list and to present the names of all candidates to the Board. When a candidate is accepted by the Board for membership, she shall notify the Corresponding Secretary. It will be the Membership Chairman’s duty to conduct the initiation ceremony of all new members at an annual meeting, and she shall help the President-Elect compose the Yearbook. The Telephone Tree shall be a subcommittee of this committee.**

**DELETE - “an annual meeting” and insert “each regular meeting”, etc. (Membership Chairman would like to initiate new members at each meeting rather than waiting until the Closing Luncheon).**

**SECTION 10 – The Ways and Means Chairman’s duties are to organize all fundraising projects of the club.**

**DELETE - Ways and Means and insert Fund Raising. (To conform with Federation).**

## **ARTICLE VIII – MEMBERSHIP**

**SECTION 1 - “Club as outlines, should be outlined”**

**SECTION 2 - The name of the candidate shall be given to the Membership Committee (should be Membership Chairman)**

## **ARTICLE IX – DUES**

**SECTION 2 - DELETE – before the Annual Meeting.**

ARTICLE XI – MEETINGS

SECTION 1 (b) Disposition of funds: (1) government regulations – should be governmental regulations.

(2) No portion of such funds shall be distributed among individual member. – should be among individual members.

ARTICLE XII –
